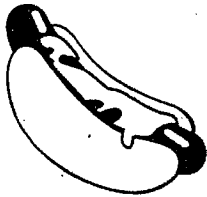
#### MEMBERSHIP MEETING

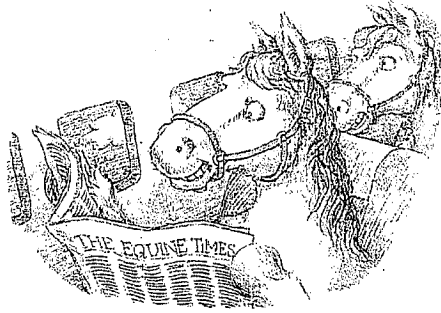

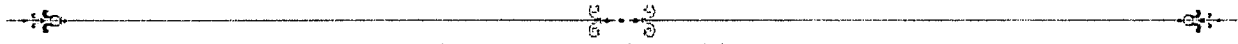

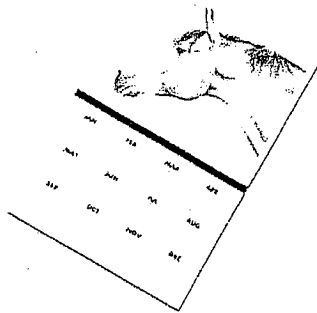

**RULES FOR HORSE SHOW ENTRY**

Have a copy of your Pinto registration papers or valid conditional reg. certificate, owner membership card, & exhibitor membership card for the secretary stand to keep on file, you only need to do this at your first show of the year

All owners & exhibitors are required to show proof of current PtHA membership and status (Youth, Novice, Amateur).

On site memberships & status must be paid by check/credit card payable to the PtHA.

All horses must be registered PtHA. Either the original/copy of original papers, or a valid conditional reg. certificate must be presented the day of the show.

1 back number will be assigned for the year per every horse and rider combination

It is the owner/exhibitor 's responsibility to provide all the above correct information a the time of entry. If the PtHA does not have the correct information it can effect your pinto's points.

**HORSE SHOW RULES**

All classes will run in accordance to the PtHA Rule Book.

Correct back number must be worn in all classes or entry may be disqualified.

Stallions may not show by any youth under the age of 18.

The show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes with less than three (3) entries.

The Pennsylvania Pinto Horse Club, it's officers, officials, management, PtHA, or anyone connected with the show/show grounds shall not be responsible for any personal injury, or for loss or damage to property, occurring at any Pa. Pinto Horse Club activity.

# 2010 PENNSYLVANIA PINTO HORSE CLUB YEAR END AWARD

## RULES & REQUIREMENTS

1. Only Pennsylvania Pinto Horse Club members in good standing are eligible to earn year end awards.
2. Points will not count until the owner of the horse's membership dues has been paid.
3. All Pinto shows held in Pennsylvania will count toward year end awards.
4. Youth/Novice Amateur/Amateur exhibitors must be a member of the Pennsylvania Pinto Horse Club to accumulate points.
5. Youth/Novice Amateur/Amateur points will be kept on a horse and rider combination; except lead-line and walk trot, those points will be kept on the exhibitor.
6. The horse must be shown at both the July 25<sup>th</sup> and August 8<sup>th</sup> shows in an individual class/performance division to be eligible for a year end award in that individual class/performance division.
7. At a minimum, awards for the following individual classes will be given to horses that acquire the highest and second highest number of points:

# PENNSYLVANIA PINTO HORSE CLUB, INC. CONSTITUTION

## **Article I. NAME:**

- 1) This organization shall be named Pennsylvania Pinto Horse Club, Incorporated (PPtHC), this organization is subject to the directions and rules established by the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors of the Pinto Horse Association of America, Inc. (PtHA).

## **Article II. PURPOSE:**

- 1) The purpose of this non-profit organization shall be to promote and encourage the breeding of Pinto Horses and to promote general interest in the Pinto Horse; To hold such horse shows, trail rides and other events as shall be deemed advisable and necessary to the promotion of the Pinto Horse; To promote the use of the registry of the PtHA as the official registry of the Pinto Horse of America; To promote good sportsmanship and good fellowship and to improve the general condition and welfare of all horses and any other social endeavors to promote the Pinto Horse; To oppose any activity that is, would be or tends to be derogatory or inauspicious to the Pinto Horse or to the Pinto Horse Association of America, Inc.; And, to further the purpose of the Pinto Horse Association of America, Inc. on a local level in the manner prescribed by the National Association, thereby assisting the National Association to continue it's promotional work on a national and international basis.

## **Article III. POLICIES:**

- 1) This organization shall have no interest in personal grievances of one member towards another and no discussion of this nature will be allowed at any meeting of the organization; likewise, no discussion of a political nature will be allowed.

## **Article IV. MEMBERSHIP:**

- 1) Membership is open to anyone of good moral character interested in promoting the Pinto Horse and their welfare and in the purpose of the National organization.

## **Article V. OFFICERS:**

- 1) All officers shall be members or become members of the Pinto Horse Association of America, Inc. to hold office in a charter association and is, therefore, a "symbol" of said association.
- 2) The officers of this association shall be a president, vice-president, and secretary/treasurer, who shall be the Executive Committee and be responsible for the routine administration and management of the organization. The duration of office shall be one (1) year, from January 1 to December 31 and until their successors have been elected and have qualified.
- 3) The officers after routine nominations shall be elected at the October or November meeting, officers will officially take office on January 1. Elections shall be closed, written ballots, each voting member (19 years & older) have the privilege of casting one (1) vote for each office. The person receiving the majority of the votes cast for each office shall be deemed to have been elected.

**Article VI.****BOARD OF DIRECTORS:**

- 1) There shall be a Board of Directors consisting of the Executive Committee and two (2) Directors elected at large from the membership who shall serve a term of three (3) years each. One director shall be elected to replace that director who has completed his/her three (3) year term. In addition to the above directors, the outgoing president shall serve a one (1) year term as director at large unless he/she has been elected to an office on the Executive Committee or as one (1) of the above mentioned elected directors. The president shall sit as chairperson of the Board of Directors and vote only to break a tie vote. The Board of Directors shall meet at the call of the president. The Executive Committee and/or the Board of Directors may call special meetings. Such special meetings may not supersede regular club meetings.

**Article VII.****AMENDMENTS:**

- 1) Any proposed amendments to the constitution may be submitted in writing at any regular meeting the organization has. Such proposed amendments must be signed by three (3) members of the organization, in good standing, before being submitted to the meeting. The secretary shall then read the proposal to the membership. After such notice, a copy of the proposed amendment shall be sent by the secretary to the newsletter editor to be published in the next newsletter issue. After such publication, the proposed amendment shall be read and discussed at the next regular meeting of the organization and then voted upon by ballot and shall become a part of the constitution only if passed by two-thirds (2/3) of the eligible members present and voting at said meeting.

**Article VIII.****EXCEPTIONS:**

- 1) Article I and Article II of this constitution may not be amended or altered in any form or manner by this affiliated association.

The constitution lays down the principles of the organization. The by-laws are chiefly the methods of procedure rather than basic principles.

**PENNSYLVANIA PINTO HORSE CLUB, INC. BY-LAWS**

**Article I. DUES:**

- 1) The annual dues of this association shall be \$25.00 for family membership (2 votes), \$20.00 for individual (19 yrs. & older)(1 vote) \$10.00 for youth (18 & under)(No vote).

**Article II. MEMBERSHIP REGULATIONS:**

- 1) Memberships run from January 1 to December 31 each year. Members will be notified in October that renewal dues are payable. Members not paid in full by March 1 will be declared delinquent and removed from the good standing membership roster. Members declared delinquent shall not be permitted to vote or participate in the organization's business.
- 2) Any member, who has been dropped from the active membership roll for any reason, in order to become reinstated, shall make a regular application for membership. Any resigning or expelled member forfeits all rights to any property of the association.
- 3) All dues and membership application forms are to be submitted to the secretary.
- 4) A copy of the PPtHC newsletter will be included with each membership. Only one (1) copy will be sent to each address, regardless of the number of members at that address. The newsletter will be sent to the member from the month that membership is paid until March 1 the following year.
- 5) Cash, check, or money order shall make all payments of membership dues, payable to the Pennsylvania Pinto Horse Club, Inc.
- 6) To hold any elected office in the PPtHC a person must be a member in good standing of the PPtHC.

**Article III. ELECTION OF OFFICERS, DIRECTORS AND REPRESENTATIVES:**

- 1) NOMINATIONS:
  - a. Nominations for officers, directors and representatives will be accepted at the general membership meeting in October or November. All nominees must have been members in good standing of PPtHA for at least three (3) months prior to being nominated.
- 2) ELECTION PROCEDURES:
  - a. Elections will be held at the general membership meeting in October or November each year.
  - b. If there is more than one member wishing to be nominated for the same office, the secretary/treasurer will mail each member eligible to vote one (1) ballot.
  - c. Election ballots will be sent by mail, to be returned to the secretary/treasurer by a designated date.
- 3) MAILED BALLOT:
  - a. Each eligible voting member will receive a ballot in an envelope addressed to them.
  - b. The Executive Committee or Board of Directors may require other mail ballots.
- 4) SEATING OF OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, AND REPRESENTATIVES:
  - a. All officers, directors and representatives, deemed elected by ballot vote, will be seated at the election meeting.
  - b. Elected officers and directors take office January 1 of their term year.
  - c. All officers, directors and representatives must pay their membership renewal dues by February 1. Any officer, director or representative failing to pay their renewal dues for their term year in office will forfeit their office.
- 5) VACANCIES DURING TERM OF OFFICE:
  - a. Any vacancies occurring during a term year shall be filled by appointment, by the president, with Board of Directors approval.
  - b. The president may authorize a special election for the purpose of filling a vacancy during a term year.

- 1) President: The president shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee, the Board of Directors and the membership. He/she shall exercise general supervision and management over all affairs of the organization and shall serve as an Ex-officio member of all standing committees who may vote only to break a tie therein, except the nominating committee.
- 2) Vice-President: The vice-president shall preside in the absence of the president.
- 3) Secretary: As secretary shall: (1) Keep and maintain the minutes of all meetings of the organization, standing committees, Executive Committee and Board of Directors. These minutes shall be an accurate and official record of all business transacted. (2) Is custodian of all association records including monthly financial reports. (3) Cause to be kept and maintained an accurate roster showing names and addresses, position held in organization of each active member. A copy of this roster will be furnished to the National Association each year after elections. (4) Cause to prepare all correspondence, reports, and routine business records of and for the organization. (5) Notify each member of all regular meetings, special meetings, social activities, and likewise, send out notices of Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. (6) Accept membership dues and issue membership cards to persons eligible to hold same. (7) Shall be responsible for the mailing of election ballots to those members eligible to vote. (8) Shall receive election ballots.
- 4) Treasurer: The treasurer shall receive all organization funds, keep said funds in a bank or depository approved by the Executive Committee keep faithful records of all itemized receipts and expenditures and disburse the organization funds only by check signed by the treasurer. The treasure must exhibit and file vouchers for all disbursements and shall file a full financial report of all income and disbursements to be published to the membership in the newsletter and, in addition, file and annual report in the newsletter.

#### **Article V. DIRECTORS:**

- 1) Election and term of office: The two directors shall hold office for three (3) years. In addition to the above directors, the outgoing president shall serve one (1) year as director-at-large, unless he/she has been elected to an office within the Executive Committee or as one of the two previously mentioned directors. A director, upon being elected to an office of the Executive Committee will be replaced by regular ballot and the newly elected director will fill the unexpired term of the director he/she will be replacing.
- 2) Duties of the Board of Directors: The Board of Directors shall be the policy making body of the organization and act upon all important issues brought before the board by the Executive Committee and the membership. The decision of the Board of Directors is final unless vetoed by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting at a regular meeting.

#### **Article VI. COMMITTEES:**

- 1) Committees other than standing committees shall be appointed and charged with responsibilities by the president. All committees appointed by the president for special purposes shall report, verbally, their proceedings at each membership meeting. No committee shall be discharged until all debts contracted by them are paid in full and a final report of the committee is made, verbally or in writing.

#### **Article VII. STANDING COMMITTEES:**

- 1) Nominating committee: This committee shall consist of a chairperson appointed by the president and two (2) members appointed by the chairperson. The committee will meet on call of the chairperson and will be constantly on the alert for potential officer material within the membership. At least thirty (30) days prior to the November meeting the committee will submit a slate of candidates for each office including the Board of Directors. The presentation of this slate does not preclude nominations from the floor.
- 2) Show committee: This committee shall consist of a chairperson appointed by the president and at least two (2) members. The committee shall meet at the call of the chairperson and prepare a recommended program for approval by simple majority vote at a membership meeting. The chairperson of the show committee shall have a vote on issues pertaining to show points and/or division awards.

#### **Article VIII. MEETINGS:**

- 1) General membership meetings: This meeting will be held at least one (1) time per calendar year with notice of time, date, and location to be given to all members in good standing no less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date of each meeting.
- 2) Board of Directors meetings: These meetings are called by the president or by four (4) directors and notice of time, date, and location will be given no less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date of the meeting to all directors. These meetings are closed to the general membership unless otherwise announced. Quorum for the conduct of business shall be four (4) directors in attendance.

- 3) Executive committee meetings: These meetings are called by the president or by four (4) officers, and notice of time, date, and location will be given no less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date of the meeting to all officers. These meetings are closed to the general membership unless otherwise announced. Quorum for the conduct of business shall be four (4) officers in attendance.
- 4) Special meetings of the membership: These meetings may be called by the president, four (4) directors, four (4) officers, or by written request signed by five (5) voting members in good standing. Notice of a special membership meeting giving the time, date, location, and agenda will be given to all members in good standing no less than ten (10) days prior to the date of the meeting. All requests for special meetings of the membership must be submitted to the president, in writing, signed by those directors, officers, or members making the request, stating the reason for the meeting call and the agenda.

**Article IX. QUORUM**

- 1) The members present at any membership meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

**Article X. ORDER OF BUSINESS**

**Article XI. RULES OF ORDER**

- 1) In the event that any part of these by-laws should conflict with the rules and regulations of the Pinto Horse Association of America, Inc., national rules and regulations will prevail. This organization will govern its procedure by "Robert's Rules of Order Revised", in all points not covered herein or provided by the Pinto Horse Association of America, Inc., rules and regulations, a copy of which shall be available at all times.

**Article XII. TRIAL BOARD**

- 1) The board of directors shall act as a trial board for this organization. The board must handle all questions of this nature. When any member in good standing file charges against any other member for conduct likely, in his/her opinion, to endanger the welfare or character of this organization, the charges **MUST** be in writing and signed by the person filing said charges. The accused member must be given a copy of the signed charges along with at least thirty (30) days notice of his/her date of hearing before the board, in which time he/she can prepare a defense. After review of the matter, the trial board will present their decision to the membership present and voting will suffice to expel a proven guilty member if such action is the decision of the trial board.
- 2) Any decision of the trial board for a punishment other than expelling a proven guilty member will stand as binding unless vetoed by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the membership present and voting.
- 3) Those accused may appeal the decision of the trial board of this organization by filing a written appeal through the Pinto Horse Association of America, Inc., whose decision is final.

**Article XIII. AMENDMENTS**

- 1) Any member at any regular meeting may propose amendments to these by-laws. Proposed amendments must first receive the approval of the Executive Committee. Secondly, it must be printed in the Pennsylvania Pinto Horse Club Bulletin. The proposed amendment must receive a majority approval, ballot return vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the membership.
- 2) Any proposed changes receiving all of the necessary approvals and votes will become effective January 1 of the following year.
